# **British Values in Geography**

### The Rule of Law

Students are aware of expectations in Geography and understand how they can respond positively to feedback. They are also aware of consequences if expectations are not followed. Geography is a dynamic subject and we discuss laws relating to migration. Also, think about laws in other countries and discuss their impacts on that country.

### **Democracy**

Students learn the importance of discussion and understanding to listen to each other's points of views. They are also given the opportunity to debate ideas in their lessons and think about their own viewpoints. We also evaluate other countries laws and how they impact societies, for example the One Child Policy.

# **Individual Liberty**

In Geography, students are encouraged to learn how to become independent learners and self-regulate their learning. Also, responding to feedback in lessons and how to improve their own learning. Metacognition is promoted in Geography.

## **Mutual Respect**

Geography students are clear on expectations and in their first Geography lesson are explained the importance to listen to one another and respect each other's viewpoints. They are advised they must listen to one other before then expressing their viewpoint. Teachers reinforce the value of everyone's opinion and the importance of listening to one another.

#### Tolerance of those of Different Faiths and Beliefs

In Geography, students follow a curriculum that discusses a range of beliefs and faiths. We explore the idea of migration and the importance of culture in the UK and the world. We also explore the idea of how difference faiths and beliefs have shaped the society we live in today. An example is climate change and the impact on the world and begin to understand people's beliefs of this complex subject.
