Students are introduced in KS3 to British Values in Art power point, which highlights and identifies some famous British Artists.

KS4

The first project for Year 10 GCSE Art and Photography, is Identity and Portrait. Pupils initially research other artists work. This is geared heavily towards self-portraits and develops pupil's self-confidence /self- image throughout, by them then producing their own.

The second unit for Year 10 GCSE Art, is based on Multi-cultural Artefacts from around the world, when pupils research the roles, beliefs and cultures other than their own. They initially research artefacts from the Ethnological Museum – Pitt Rivers in Oxford. This did not happen last year due to covid restrictions however it has been planned for year11.

Year 11 is usually mainly focused on the examination prep and completion. These responses to the starting points are an accumulation and celebration of their work throughout the school. Many students move on to study Art and Design and Photography at Further Educational establishments and University, which in itself is a reflection of their own personal developments.
