The Wiltshire Police Youth and Early Intervention team works with schools, colleagues and partners to share messages and educate young people, with the aim to keep young people in our community safe from harm and exploitation.

Dear Parent/Guardian/Carer,

This year's Op Sceptre campaign is running from 15th November – 21st November nationally, and to Friday 26th November in Wiltshire and Swindon.

During Op Sceptre weeks, Wiltshire Police are raising awareness about weapons and knife crime with young people, families and communities within Swindon and Wiltshire.

We need your help to ensure that every young person knows about the risks of carrying knives or other weapons; to support them to make informed choices to keep themselves and their peers safe, and to know where to go for help or to report concerns.

Signs that a young person may be vulnerable to exploitation or involvement with knife/weapons:

- Is your young person/young people hanging around with a new group of friends? A group that you don't know or have never met?
- Is your young person suddenly wearing new and possibly expensive items of clothing or accessories, that you haven't bought for them?
- Does your young person have more than one phone?
- Have they started to become more irritable every time you try to engage with them?
- Are they becoming more secretive, always in their bedroom, not engaging in family activities/outings?
- Is your young person missing school? Or having missing episodes from home?

Whilst most of these signs can be described as 'typical' teenage behaviour, there could be more to it. If your gut feeling is telling you that something isn't right, then ask questions, and/or ask for advice.

When your young person goes out:

- Do you know where they are going? Do you know who they are with?
- What time do they need to be back by?
- Ensure you have contact details for their friends and parents, guardians or carers
